

FINAL DOCUMENT
of the digital 39th Session of the Baltic Assembly

The Baltic Assembly,

having convened for its digital 39th Session on 6 November 2020,

having discussed current affairs and cooperation of the Baltic states, unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic risks and challenges, countering the COVID-19 crisis impact on economy, social and health care, cooperation in security and defence, common energy market, development of the *Rail Baltica* project and other infrastructure projects, joint education, research and culture projects;

adopted the **Resolution** of the digital 39th Session of the Baltic Assembly;

approved the Report on the Implementation of the Budget of the Baltic Assembly for 2019;

adopted the Budget of the Baltic Assembly for 2021;

approved the Decision on the Leadership of the Presidium and Committees of the Baltic Assembly in 2021;

adopted the Decision on Secretary General of the Baltic Assembly;

defined the following priorities of the Baltic Assembly for 2021:

- 1) Economic and social stabilisation of the Baltic states;
- 2) Strong security and defence community;
- 3) Interconnected energy and transport networks;
- 4) Safe societies and quality of life;

defined the following priorities for cooperation between the Baltic Assembly and the Baltic Council of Ministers for 2021:

- 1) Regional security, including Eastern Partnership and transatlantic relations;
- 2) Cyber cooperation;
- 3) Connectivity, including regional energy and transport projects, and digital cooperation;
- 4) Climate change and environmental issues;
- 5) Cooperation in culture and healthcare.

decided that the 40th Session of the Baltic Assembly will take place on 4–5 November 2021 in Vilnius, Republic of Lithuania.
